





NYC Juvenile Arrests Declined (-22%) Since 2011; Felony (-14%), Misdemeanor (-26%)


Rest of State Juvenile Arrests/Criminal Activity Down (-9%) Since 2011, (-30%) Since 2008


JO Arrests Down (-29%) in 2012, Fewest Reported Since Juvenile Offender Act of 1978 was Enacted

Juvenile Offender Arrests – Robbery Still Most Common Offense in 2012



NYC Juvenile Probation Intake Cases Opened*





NYC Probation Adjustment Rate Decreased From 37% to 34% While Number of Case Closed Decreased (-19%)



Rest of State Probation Adjustment Rate 46%; Same as 2011







Rest of State Detention Admission on Counties with More Than 20 Cases in 2012*











NYC JD/DF Initial Petition Filings: By Gender and Charge in 2012



ROS JD/DF Initial Petition Filings: By Gender and Charge in 2012






Initial Dispositions Resulting in Placements: NYC Down (-27%) Since 2009; Rest of State Down (-9%)



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Rest of State Regional Initial Placements by Type: 2011 vs. 2012



Regional Placements Comparing Initially Placed and Ever Placed: Petitions in 2010*



Total OCFS Admissions Down (-49%) Since 2008; Since 2011, NYC Decreased (-17%) while Rest of State Decreased (-1.5%)



OCFS Total Admissions Declined (-11%) in 2012



Total OCFS in Care down (-55%) Since 2008; Since 2011, NYC Decreased (-32%) while Rest of State Decreased (-2%)



Total Custody in Care Decline Continues: Drop (-20%) in 2012, driven mostly by Voluntary Agencies and Community Services



Statewide Youth in Custody in OCFS Residential Facilities By Custody Level: 2011 vs. 2012





Juvenile Admissions to OCFS Custody: Declined (-61%) Statewide


